PROCESS TO PROMOTE THE UNITY AND STABILITY OF FAMILIES: INFO ON NEW PAROLE-IN-PLACE(PIP) PROCESS

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Be present in the U.S. without admission or parole;
 - Have been continuously present in the U.S. for at least ten years as of June 17, 2024;
 - Be legally married to a U.S. citizen as of June 17, 2024;
 - Have no disqualifying criminal history or pose a threat to national security/public safety; and
 - Merit a favorable exercise of discretion.
- NOTE: *Noncitizen children* of spouses granted parole under this process may also be considered for parole on a case-by-case basis if they are physically present in the United States without admission or parole and have a qualifying stepchild relationship with a U.S. citizen stepparent as of June 17, 2024.

WHAT DOCUMENTS CAN HELP ME MEET THE REQUIREMENTS?

DOCUMENT CONTINUOUS U.S. PRESENCE FROM 2014-2024

REMINDERS:

You may be eligible if:

- 1.** You have a qualifying family relationship to a U.S. citizen, in other words:
 - You have a legally valid marriage to a U.S. citizen as of June 17, 2024 OR
 - You are a child or qualifying stepchild of a U.S. citizen and were physically present in the U.S. as of June 17, 2024.
- 2.** You are present in the U.S. without admission or parole (did not enter the U.S. with a visa or other official document issued to you).
- 3.** Do not have criminal history that will disqualify you or makes you a threat to national security or public safety (USCIS will issue more information about this)

REMINDERS:

- USCIS will begin accepting applications on August 19, 2024.
- Additional information about eligibility requirements will be issued soon through a Federal Register Notice.
